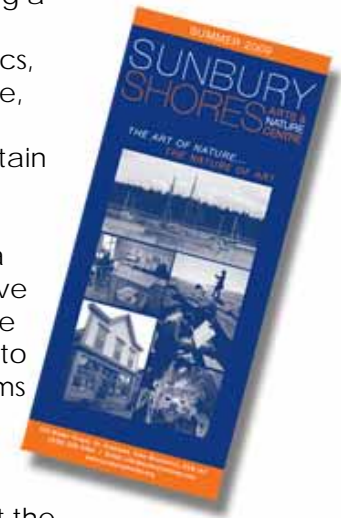

**Encaustic Painting
with Sarah Petite
takes place from
July 13 – 17, 2009**

New this summer at Sunbury Shores, we are pleased to offer a number of new courses, including **Encaustic Painting** with Sarah Petite.

It waits, molten and ready, in little cans on a hotplate. You paint with sawed-off brushes on sturdy wood; when it's hot, it's "wet", when cool it's "dry", and in between you can do anything that wax will take, to get the effects you want. You can paint, drip, re-melt, wet-brush, dry-brush, puddle, stamp, stencil, scrape, fill, as you move toward the finished painting. Lots of hands-on experimentation will make you an expert in no time.

Did you know that there are currently 16 species at risk in the Province of New Brunswick including eight animals and eight plants? Animals currently protected by provincial legislation are:

1. Leatherback Turtle
2. Eastern Cougar
3. Harlequin Duck
4. Maritime Ringlet Butterfly
5. Peregrine Falcon
6. Piping Plover
7. Bald Eagle
8. Canada Lynx
