PRINTSHOP GETS LITHO PRESS



The missing piece of the printshop puzzle is now in place!

A Laguna lithography press from Pressworks (a printmakers co-op in Seattle, Washington in the process of downsizing), has found a new home in the printshop at Sunbury Shores. What this means is that lithographs can now be produced at the centre.

Lithography is the art of printing from a flat stone (limestone) or metal plate by a method based on the simple fact that grease attracts grease as it repels water. A design or image is drawn on the surface with a greasy material - grease crayon, pencil or ink - and then water and printing ink are applied. The greasy parts absorb the ink and the wet parts do not. Our new press was purchased with funds donated through the CLASS Program and the students can't wait to use it. Come in to Sunbury Shores to see the new addition!

SUMMER ART FOR KIDS

Sunbury Shores has an exciting **Summer 2010 children's program**, led by artist and educator **Chantal Vincent**.

Children ages 5 through 12 will have an opportunity create insect and spider-inspired art, make cool things out of clay, design birdhouses, learn what lurks in the deep sea, make art using discarded, demolished and recycled items, work with wire, beads, found and natural objects and get crafty with dragons, gargoyles, fairies, or mermaids.

Many of the courses for kids include a trip to **Kingsbrae Garden** where students will see insects, birds and animals, as well as plants and flowers.

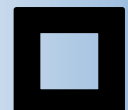

ST. ANDREWS

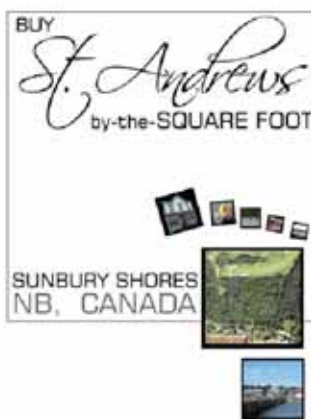

A French naval officer, explorer, ecologist, filmmaker, innovator, scientist, photographer, author and researcher, Cousteau studied the sea and all forms of life in water. He left his mark forever on the planet and the oceans. When he and his teams embarked aboard Calypso to explore the world, no one yet knew about the effects of pollution, over-exploitation of resources and coastal development.
