WHO DID WHAT?



You could be buying an original **Robert Bateman** painting for less than \$100... Sunbury Shores is asking art buyers to trust their instincts during the **Guess Who?** art event taking place this **October 2nd** at the **W.C. O'Neill Arena** in St. Andrews.

Guess Who? is a mystery art sale where the art is signed only on the reverse, so the artist remains a secret until after the work has been purchased. Each work is the same size and has the same price tag of \$90, which is a great deal considering that most of

these pieces are worth much more than \$100 and in some cases have a value of more than \$5000!

Local and national artists, craftspeople, writers, musicians, and radio / television personalities have been "getting creative" and works of art are coming in daily including those from wildlife artist **Robert Bateman**, CTV meteorologist **Cindy Day**, comedian **Lorne Elliott**, CBC radio host **Jian Ghomeshi** and CTV's Canada AM host **Seamus O'Regan**. There are also incredible creations from **Tom Smith**, **Ann Manuel**, **Herménégilde Chiasson**, **William Forrestall** and more. Nearly one hundred works of art will be available for purchase by the public in a one-day sale. But, you must have a ticket for a chance to buy the work.

For \$10, collectors can purchase a ticket, which gives them entrance to the **Guess Who?** event featuring live music, finger food and wine. Each ticket also gives buyers a chance at being chosen to purchase one of these mysterious works of art. The more tickets you buy, the better your chances at being chosen.

Sunbury Shores has a new Executive Director. James (Jamie) Steel is an award winning naturalist and environmental educator who graduated with a Master's degree from the University of Waterloo in Ontario. Jamie came to New Brunswick in 1984 to teach at a Saint John area private school and moved to St. Andrews in 1986 to direct public education programs at the Huntsman Marine Science Centre. During his time at the Huntsman, Jamie was recognized with a New Brunswick Merit Award for his work in Environmental Education and the Gulf of Maine Council's first Visionary Award. In recent years, Jamie has been providing New Brunswick based promotion, production, event planning and music management to the Maritimes and musicians who are touring Atlantic Canada from outside of the region.



Jamie is taking over from Jan Mulder who has been the acting Executive Director since 2008. With the exception of the summer of 2010, (when she was a paid employee), Jan performed her duties as Director, as a volunteer. During Jan's term as Executive Director, Sunbury Shores was transformed into a vibrant, financially stable centre. Under Jamie's leadership and with the continued support of the Board of Directors, Sunbury Shores is positioned to be an inspirational and enduring community, promoting inclusive creative experiences in the art of nature and the nature of art.



Jamie has been working closely with Jan during the summer months, preparing to take over the reigns. His plans include expanding current efforts to include more nature and music programs. We are excited to welcome Jamie on board as Sunbury Shores' new Executive Director and we are thrilled that Jan will remain involved at Sunbury Shores as an active member of the board. She will also continue to head the CLASS program, which she initiated six years ago. However, after nearly two years of devoting much of her time to Sunbury, Jan is looking forward to having more free time to spend on her own projects and with her granddaughter Jannique.

Pablo Picasso was born on October 25, 1881. The son of an art teacher, Picasso (not surprisingly) displayed enormous talent at a very early age. He was a painter, a sculptor, a ceramicist and a graphic artist. In fact, he was a master of any medium or art form he chose to try his hand at. Picasso, along with Georges Braque succeeded in his attempts to create a revolutionary new art form - Cubism. These two artists let the art world know and see that several points of view of an object could be viewed at one time. In addition, they put forward the idea of spatial reconstruction and they expressed perfectly the idea that even though depth could be "faked", painting is in fact a 2-dimensional art form. Picasso died on April 8, 1973.
